

Immigration solicitors and legal advisers

People claiming asylum must have a legal adviser. This adviser must be registered and can be:



- A solicitor
- OISC immigration adviser
- A barrister
- CILEX Immigration Practitioner



Registered advisers have to follow rules and support is available if something goes wrong.

They will . . .

- ✓ Listen to you
- ✓ Be honest with you
- ✓ Explain your options clearly
- ✓ Involve you in decision making
- ✓ Get things done on time
- ✓ Make sure you know your rights
- ✓ Give you copies of your documents
- ✓ Tell you in writing what they will charge you
- ✓ Give you a receipt for anything you pay
