## Immigration solicitors and legal advisers

People claiming asylum must have a legal adviser. This adviser must be registered and can be:



- A solicitor
- OISC immigration adviser
- A barrister
- CILEX Immigration Practitioner



Registered advisers have to follow rules and support is available if something goes wrong.

## They will . . .

- Listen to you
- Be honest with you
- Explain your options clearly
- ✓ Involve you in decision making
- ✓ Get things done on time
- Make sure you know your rights
- Give you copies of your documents
- Tell you in writing what they will charge you
- Give you a receipt for anything you pay
